CALL FOR EXPERTS TO CONDUCT A CHILD RIGHTS POLICY-GAP ASSESSMENT IN THE **IGAD** REGION

Save the Children is the leading global independent organisation for children. Save the Children believes every child deserves a future. Save the Children supports a wide range of stakeholders including the Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD) in achieving child rights and promoting child-centered approaches into their policy, programmatic and advocacy interventions.

Background

The Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD) is one of the eight regional economic communities (REC) recognized by the African Union, comprising eight member states namely Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Kenya, Somalia, Sudan, South Sudan and Uganda.

With the aim to foster peace and economic and social development through advanced regional cooperation and integration, IGAD strives to support the efforts of its member states in various areas, including peace, security, environment, economic cooperation, health and social development. To that end, IGAD has developed many policies to set common regional standards in relevant areas. Recently, it adopted a Child Policy Framework to promote the rights and welfare of children in line with member states' international and continental commitments.

To support IGAD and its member states in gaining a clearer understanding of the pre-policy implementation context and providing evidence of existing gaps in child rights, Save the Children, through the East African Migration Routes Project (EAMR), will provide technical and financial backstopping to IGAD in hiring a consultant. This consultant will conduct a comprehensive policy



gap analysis, identifying areas for improvement to ensure alignment with the Child Policy's goals and strategies.

The assessment report will be leveraged to strengthen advocacy efforts for the fulfilment of IGAD member states' international and continental commitments.

OBJECTIVES

The main purpose of this assignment is to identify gaps in existing legal and policy frameworks and governance structures against the standards set by the IGAD Child Policy to propose areas of improvement. The Policy-gap analysis will enable to:

- Identify the applicable national legal and policy frameworks and governance structures relevant to child rights across the thematic areas of the IGAD Child Policy
- Identify the inconsistencies and gaps in legal and policy frameworks compared to the goals, standards and strategies of the IGAD Child Policy.
- Map the reports member states have submitted to the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) and the African Committee of Experts on the Rights and Welfare of the Child (ACERWC).
- Evaluate whether current policies effectively address the vulnerabilities of specific categories of children, including children living with disabilities, children on the move, children affected by armed conflict, children in conflict with the law, among others.
- Assess to what extent existing policies and governance structures are well equipped to address transnational threats and emerging risks to child rights in the IGAD region.
- Identify best practices of member states in policy and programmatic interventions that need to be scaled up to promote and fulfil children's rights.
- Propose actionable recommendations to address the identified gaps and ensure alignment with UNCRC, the ACRWC and the IGAD Child Policy.

EXPECTED TASKS

The consultant is expected to take the following tasks:

1. Legal and Policy Review:

- Conduct a comprehensive review of national legal and policy frameworks relevant to child rights in IGAD member states across the thematic areas specified in the IGAD Child Policy The review will analyse national child policies for alignment with IGAD Child Policy and other intersecting policies linked to the Child Policy priorities.
- Analyse governance structures overseeing child rights implementation.

2. Gap Analysis:

- Identify inconsistencies and gaps in national laws and policies compared to the IGAD Child Policy, UNCRC, and ACRWC.
- o Identify inconsistencies between national child policies and other intersecting policies to identify explicit conflicts across national legislation & policies
- Assess weaknesses in the enforcement mechanisms of child rights policies



3. Evaluation of Policy Effectiveness:

- Assess whether current policies effectively address the vulnerabilities of specific categories of children, such as children with disabilities, children on the move, and children affected by armed conflict.
- Examine the responsiveness of policies to emerging risks and transnational threats affecting children's rights in the region.

4. Mapping of Reports:

- Collect and analyse reports submitted by IGAD member states to the UNCRC and ACERWC.
- o Identify trends, compliance levels, and key challenges highlighted in these reports.

5. Identification of Best Practices:

- Document successful policies and programmatic interventions effectively promoting and protecting child rights in IGAD member states.
- o Highlight scalable initiatives for regional implementation.

6. Recommendations and Policy Proposals:

- Include a list of specific law and policy provisions that are missing and/or conflicting with UNCRC, ACRWC & IGAD Child Policy, providing a comprehensive list of policy changes.
- Provide actionable recommendations & strategies to address identified gaps and ensure alignment with international, continental and regional standards.
- Suggest mechanisms for enhancing cross-border collaboration on child rights issues.

EXPECTED DELIVERABLES

The expert(s) is/are expected to undertake the following tasks:

- 1. **Inception Report:** Detailed methodology, scope of work and work plan.
- 2. Summary report of initial findings with proposed outline for the final report highlighting
 - Legal, Policy and Governance Review
 - Gap Analysis
 - Evaluation on Policy Effectiveness to address vulnerabilities of specific categories as well as transnational and emerging child rights threats.
 - o Documentation of best practices in policy and interventions in member states.

3. Final Report and Policy Recommendations

- Comprehensive report consolidating all findings.
- Clear recommendations for policy alignment and improvement.
- 4. **Presentation** to IGAD for validation and participation in an advocacy workshop with other relevant stakeholders.



REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- Advanced degree in Law, Human Rights, Social Sciences, Public Policy, or related fields.
- Extensive experience in legal and policy analysis, particularly in child rights frameworks.
- Strong knowledge of international and regional child rights instruments, including UNCRC, ACRWC, and IGAD Child Policy.
- Experience in working with IGAD member states or similar regional organizations.
- Proven expertise in conducting complex research, gap analyses, policy reviews, and governance assessments.
- Ability to synthesize complex legal and policy issues into actionable recommendations.
- Excellent research, writing, and presentation skills.
- Fluency in English is required; knowledge of French or other IGAD regional languages is an asset.

The duration of the assignment will be across the timeline of May - August 2025. A detailed timeline will be agreed upon during the inception phase.

The total budget for this assignment will be negotiated based on the scope of work and deliverables. Payment will be made in two instalments linked to the successful completion of key milestones.
